IDEAL AGE: 1+

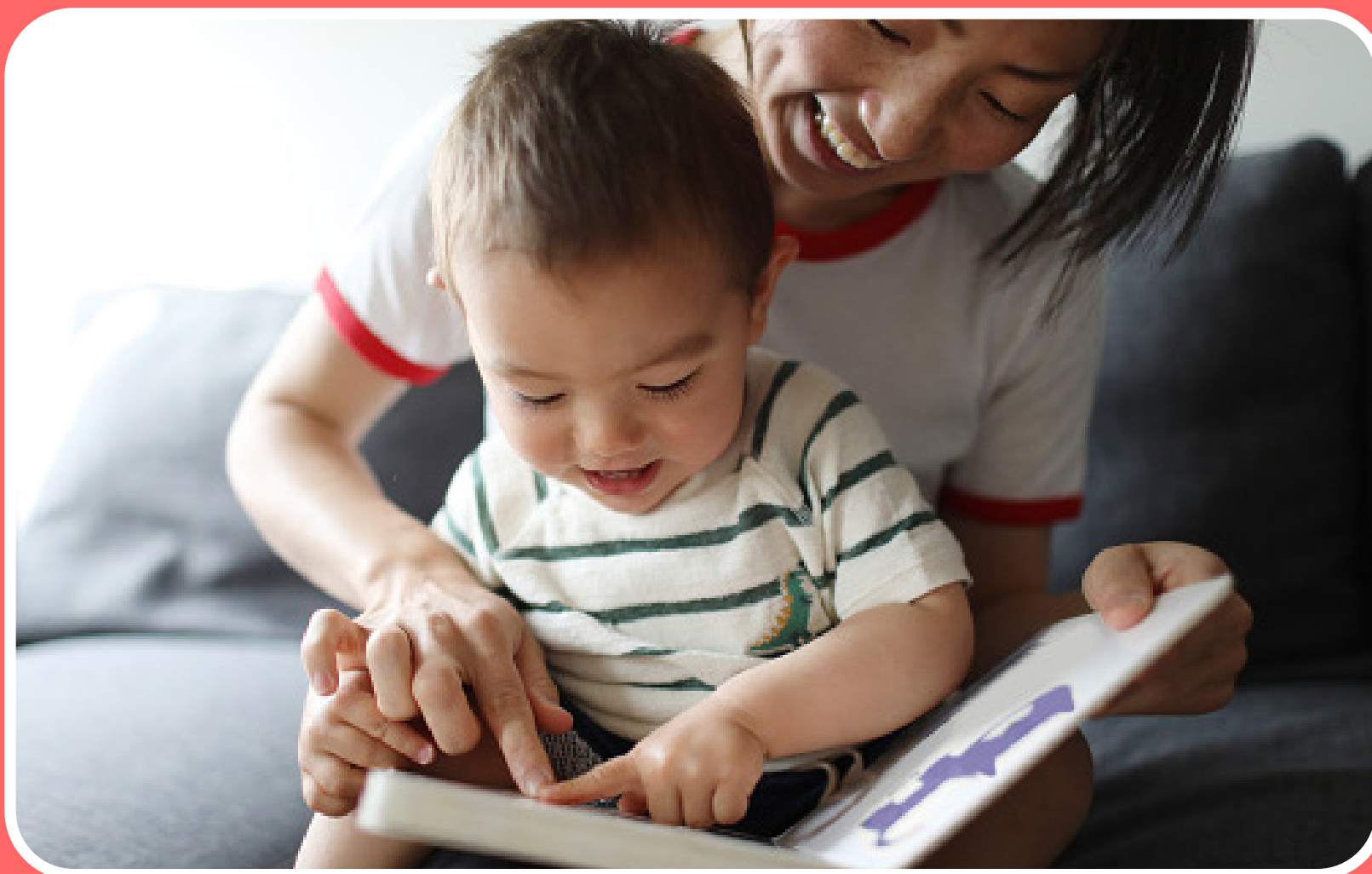
What makes you special? What makes you who you are? Watch and listen to this storytime of I'd Know You Anywhere by Nancy Tillman.

LEARN TOGETHER

Boost your child's self-esteem and language development by reading stories, asking questions, and talking together about your special traits.

MATERIALS

- Computer, tablet, or phone to watch the video
- A comfortable seat
- Some paper
- Crayons, markers, or pencils



MAKE TOGETHER

- 1 Watch a reading of [I'd Know You Anywhere](#) by Nancy Tillman. This book is all about finding the special parts of ourselves that shine through even when we aren't feeling quite like ourselves.
- 2 After the story, sit together and make a list of all of the special things that make you who you are!

Do you have a special dance you do? How about a unique face you make when you taste something delicious? Are your hugs just the best? Maybe you know a lot about something and love to share?
- 3 Try turning some of those words and features into a poem or a song together. Remember, it doesn't have to rhyme!
- 4 When you are feeling sad, mad, or maybe not like your usual self, revisit your list for a reminder of what makes you so very special.
