



Nature Sun Catchers

Celebrate nature by creating a sun catcher to hang on your window! As you look outside, talk together with your child about the weather, colors and what you see.

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Paper plate
- Wax paper or contact paper
- Markers
- Glue stick
- Scissors
- 3"-5" string
- Tissue paper cut to 1" squares
- Nature items: leaves, twigs, flowers, etc.
- Nature magazines for cutting out pictures and words
- Letters (foam, felt, stickers or cut out from magazines)

STEPS


- 1. Gather materials.
- 2. Cut out a large circle in the middle of the paper plate.
- 3. Glue a piece of wax paper to the back of the plate to cover the open circle.
- 4. Glue tissue paper to the back of the plate covering the wax paper.
- 5. Cut out nature-inspired words from a magazine and glue them to the front of the paper plate.
- 6. Glue nature items to decorate the front of your plate.
- 7. Let dry.
- 8. Punch a hole on the top of the plate. Thread string into the hole and knot it to create a loop.
- 9. Hang in your window!

HAVE A CONVERSATION!

- What colors do you see during the day? At night?
- How does your sun catcher look in the sun? The rain?
- How does the sun make you feel? How does it feel to watch the rain through the window?
